1. The Meeting received a deputation from the Students' Council composed of Messrs Hamilton, Copeland and Fraser. These gentlemen presented a resolution passed by the Students' Council requesting that the Board of Governors sanction the erection of the proposed Gymnasium on one site only, namely that of Macdonald Park. This Resolution was endorsed by the Presidents of all the Athletic Associations and all the Undergraduate Societies. The Deputation set forth very fully the reasons for this request, and after a lengthy discussion it was agreed to ask the Principal and Mr. Ross to meet the endorsers of this Resolution and discuss with them the location of the Gymnasium Building site.

2. In regard to the furnishing of additional accommodation for the Faculty of Applied Science, Dr. Adams submitted a proposal from his Faculty to the effect that the workshop instruction at present being given in the University should be done at the Montreal Technical School. The terms of the arrangement which Dr. Adams proposed were as follows;
