MANITOBA AFFAIRS.

Dr. Moore asked and obtained leave, on behalf of the Committee on the relations of the Superintendent of Missions to the Synod of Manitoba and the North-West, and the Presbyteries thereof, as also on defining the boundaries of said Presbyteries, to meet for business during the next Sederunt of the Assembly.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Assembly adjourned, to meet again at half-past seven o'clock, of which intimation was given, and the Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

ELEVENTH SEDERUNT.

On the same day, and at the same place, at half-past seven o'clock in the evening:—
The Assembly met in pursuance of adjournment in the afternoon, and was constituted with devotional exercises—Mr. W. S. Ball, at the request of the Moderator, offering prayer.
The Minutes of the last Sederunt were read and sustained.

FRENCH EVANGELIZATION.

The Assembly called for the Report of the Committee on French Evangelization. The report was presented in printed form by Principal MacVicar, who directed attention briefly to some of the leading features of an encouraging nature contained therein; giving a short summary of the results achieved, and of the financial condition of the enterprise, and mentioning the good service rendered by the French newspaper and the Pointe aux Trembles school. The following resolution was moved by Mr. Thomas Cumming, of Montreal, and seconded by Mr. C. E. Amaron:—Receive and adopt the Report; thank the Committee, and especially the Convener for their valuable services; express our gratitude to God for the encouraging measure of success vouchsafed to the mission during the past year, and cordially commend the work to the sympathy, prayers and generous support of the whole Church. The resolution was supported by Mr. W. D. Armstrong, of Ottawa, by Mr. Charles A. Tanner, of St. Andrew's, Scarborough, and by Mr. Charles Chiniquy.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Assembly adjourned to meet again at ten o'clock to-morrow morning, of which public intimation was given, and the Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

TWELFTH SEDERUNT.
