## The PIAUHAU, Buff.

Mufcicapa Rubricollis, Gmel. Mufoicapa Cayanenfis Nigra Major, Briff. The Purple-throated Flycatcher, Lath.

The Piauhau is larger than any of the Tyrants, and is therefore excluded from the Flycatchers; indeed, except in its bill, it bears not the leaft analogy to thefe, and feems to occupy a detached place in the order of Nature.

It is eleven inches long, and is larger than the Miffel Thrufh. All its plumage is deep black, except a deep purple fpot that covers the throat in the male, but is wanting in the female ; the wings, when clofed, extend as far as the end of the tail; the bill is fixteen lines long, and eight broad at the bafe, very flat, and fhaped almost like an ifosceles triangle, with a final hook at the point.

Thefe birds move in flocks, and commonly precede the Toucans, and always uttering the fhrill cry *pibaubau*: it is faid that they feed upon fruits like the Toucans; but probably they alfo eat the winged infects, for the catching of which Nature feems to have tafhioned their bill. They are very lively, and almost in continual motion. They refide only in the woods like the Toucans, and generally haunt the fame fpots.
