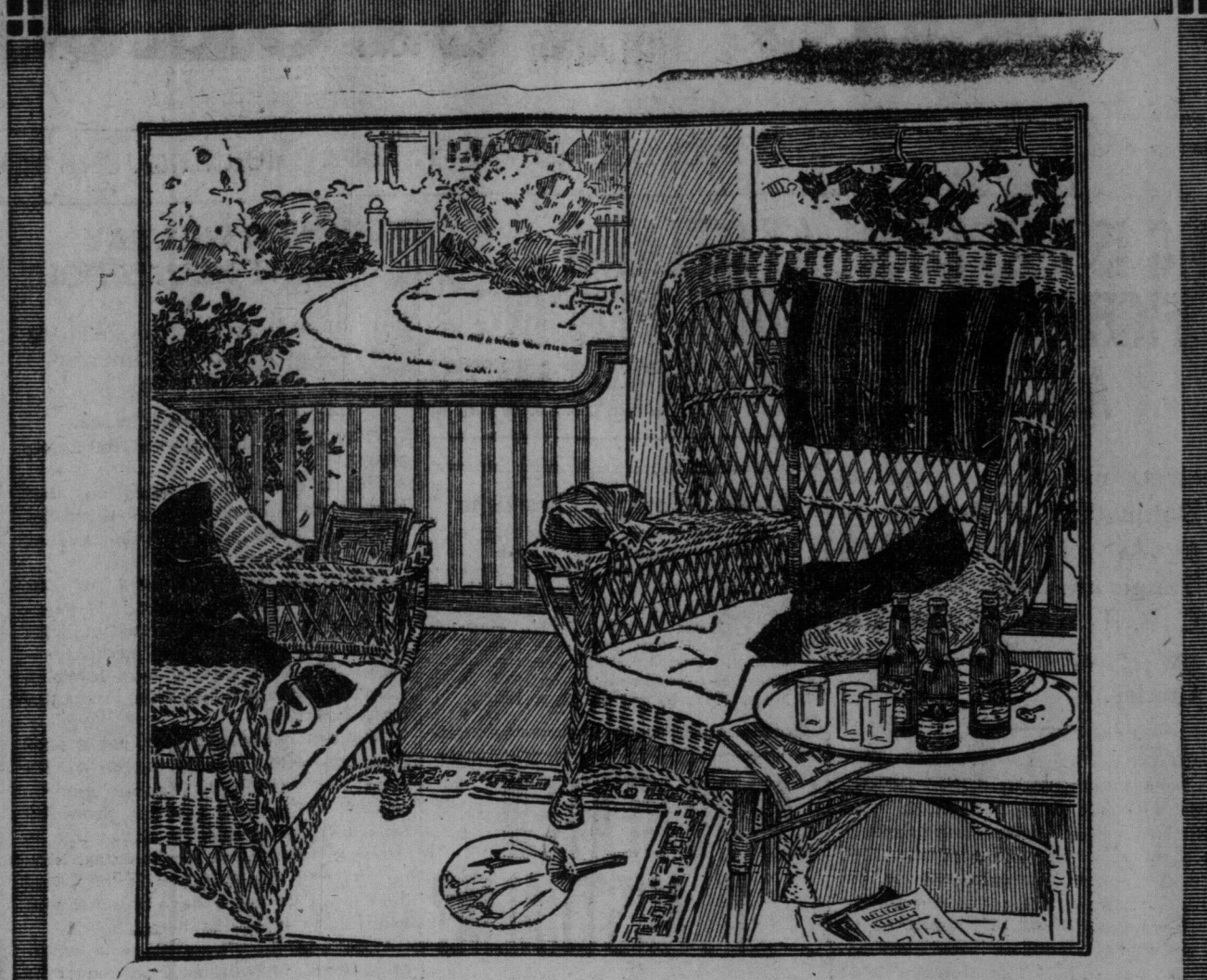

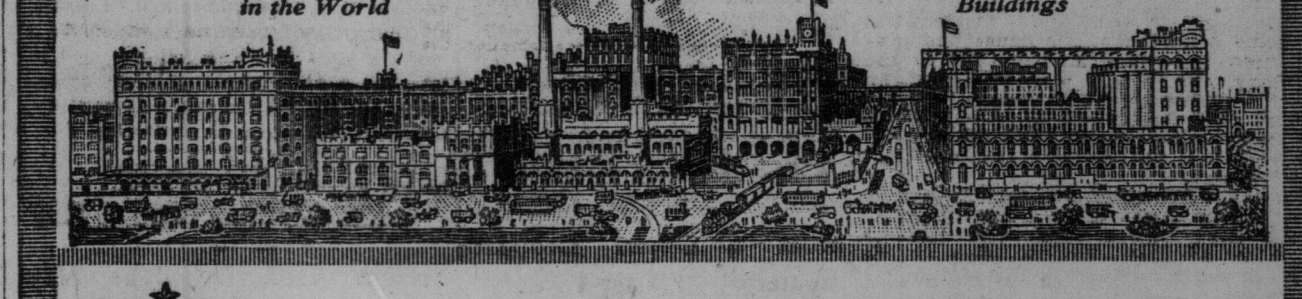

**TENDERS FOR WEDGING.**  
SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned, and endorsed "Tender for Wedging, Trenton, Ont.," will be received until 4.30 p.m. on Thursday, June 13, 1913, for wedging required at Trenton, Ont. Tenders will not be considered unless accompanied by the actual signatures of the tenderer. Combined specifications and form of tender can be obtained on application to the Secretary, Department of Public Works, Ottawa, Ontario, or by mail, enclosing the towing of the plant to and from the work. Dredges and tugs not owned and operated by the contractor must be employed in the performance of the work contracted for. Contractors must be ready to begin work within thirty days after the date they have been notified of the acceptance of their tender. Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a certified bank, payable to the order of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, for fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500), which will be forfeited if the person tendering declines to enter into a contract when called upon to do so, or fail to complete the work specified in the contract. If the tender is not accepted the cheque will be returned. The Department does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.

**SYNOPSIS OF DOMINION LAND REGULATIONS.**  
ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The application must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of not less than 40 acres within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned by the homesteader, or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader may earn his homestead by pre-empting a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homesteading (including the time required to earn homestead) (patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500. By order, L. K. JONES, Asst.
