REGRET IN FRONT ENTIRE JOURNEY

Pebbles Second and Sharp-shooter Third—Winner Paid Well in Pools.

LOUISVILLE, May 8.—Leading all the way from the time of the barrier Harry Whitney's Regret, daughter of Broomstick-Jersey Lightning, won the Kentucky Derby over a mile and a quarter course at Churchill Downs here today.

Her margin of victory over Pebbles, James G. Butler's colt, was two lengths, with Schuyler L. Parson's gelding Sharp-shooter a half length behind. Her time was 2:05 2-5, three seconds slower than the track record.

The field was the largest that ever started in the Derby, first run at Churchill Downs in 1875. The gross value of the stakes was \$14,000; the net value to the winner was \$11,400.

Seven of the best three-year-olds of the east met ten of the west's star performers in that division, and the result was a complete victory for the eastern contingent. All three owners of the horses finishing in the money are residents of New York. Royal II, an imported English colt, entered by Jefferson Livingston of Cincinnati, was fourth, with Emerson Cochran, a Kentucky colt, fifth.

Mr. Whitney witnessed the victory of his filly. Other visitors at the course included William F. McCombe, New York chairman of the Democratic National committee; former United States Senator Johnson N. Camden, James Butler, Foxhall Keene, Andrew Miller, Barney Dreyfus and August Belmont.

Regret was installed favorite in the betting, but so open was the contest thought to be that \$2 winning mutual tickets paid \$7.20.
