

WONDERFUL BATTING PERFORMANCE BY CAPT. IRVINE OF RIDLEY COLLEGE

Hitting Up Seventy-Six Runs
Without a Chance—Upper
Canada Beaten at St. Catharines Under Ideal Conditions by One-Sided Score.

Quite a few visited St. Catharines on Saturday to witness the deciding game between Ridley and Upper Canada for the championship of the Little Big Four college cricket series. Both eleven had gone thru victorious over St. Andrews and T.C.S., and, barring an advantage of the home field, the chances looked fairly even. However, the Ridley side played a vastly superior in every department, not only with the wicket, but won by 18 runs—210 to 74. U.C.C. bowlers had performed splendidly against the other rivals, but had no terrors for the Ridley batsmen. Changes were frequent throughout, without much effect.

The honors of the day went to "Miles" Irvine, the popular captain of the team, who was in first with "Shrimp" Mills, and long before the first ball was bowled the game looked safe from Harry Griffiths' standpoint. Mills stayed at the wicket an hour for 10, and when he sent up one to McWhinney at square leg the telegraph scores began to show that Irvine was hitting confidently and actually, scoring his half-century almost entirely behind the wicket—late hitting and to square leg. The side were almost all in batting form. Wood, Turnbull, Garrett, Alexander and Jenoure also showing a peculiar fondness for the trundling.

Irvine's wicket was the fifth to go, but still the home team kept on merrily rolling up the runs. Late in his innings Irvine displayed some absolutely not give a chance until, playing one from Henderson, he raised it to short square leg and retired with 76 to his credit.

With Jenoure and Gus Porter nicely settled, and Hugh McCulloch and H. Williams eager to get a crack at the ball, the innings was declared closed at 210. U.C.C. had three hours to get the runs, but were not nearly equal to the task. Murray alone mastered the bowling, scoring 51 by the cricketer, the Thompson was going nicely when he was unfortunately run out. The Toronto boys total reached 74, or just two less than Irvine's contribution.

The fielding was smart, sharp and clean, and the friendliness of feeling was shown on both sides.

U.C.C. had a number of hours left, and in the follow-up had no difficulty in batting out time. A feature was a wonderful catch in the long field by Porter. Among the Toronto visitors were G. H. Gooderham, M.L.A., and Dr. Wright. The day was ideal, and also the breeze. In fact, it looked so much like a perfect day for cricket, that the crowd sent the home team to bat.

There was quite a large attendance, and everyone enjoyed the splendid form displayed by the winners in batting, bowling and fielding, and also Alexander's wicket-keeping. The experts in the pavilion gave it as their opinion that the team was better than last season's champions, and that they would have a great chance to lift the Robertson Cup, should they hear the cry of "Winners!"

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres, and erect a house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
