## EFFORT TO PASS TARIFF MEASURE BY NEW YEAR'S

United States Congress Abandons Usual Holiday Week of Recess.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 19.—By abandoning the usual Christmas-New Year's recess for the first time in years, Congressmen here plan to put through a heavy program this week and present several pieces of legislation to the country as holiday gifts. Farmers' relief measures hold the leading places on the program, which contemplates the final adoption of the resolution to revive the war finance corporation, passage by the House before Christmas of the emergency tariff bill relating to agricultural products, and progress on several other important measures.

To Read It Today. Chairman Fordney, who was authorized to report the tariff bill for the ways and means committee, is expected to have it read in the House early tomorrow and to ask that it come up for consideration Tuesday, or Wednesday at the latest. Members of the committee supporting the bill desire to see it passed by the House before the Christmas recess and have asked senate leaders to clear the way for putting it through that body before New Year's.

Rates Agreed Upon. Products to which tariff protection would apply and the rates agreed upon were as follows: Wheat, 30c a pound; wool in the grease, 15c a pound; skirted, 20c a pound; mutton and lamb, 25c a pound; pig, 20c a pound; corn, 10c a bushel; flour, 20c per cent ad valorem; corn, 15c a bushel; sheep, 15c a head of under one year old and 20c a head of over one year old; onions, 40c a bushel; peanuts, 2c a pound; rice, 2c a pound if cleaned and 1½c a pound if uncleaned; potatoes, 25c a bushel; long staple cotton, 7c a pound; and cottonseed, coconut, peanut and soy bean oils, 20c a gallon.

## BRANTFORD LABOR BUREAU CRITICISED BY RETURNED MEN

Unemployed Veterans Will Register With Secretary of G. W. V. A.

BRANTFORD, Dec. 19.—A representative committee was appointed by returned soldiers at a largely attended meeting here this afternoon to take up the matter of the unemployment of returned men, and endeavor to alleviate their position.

It was estimated that less than 200 were out of work in the city, and while there was a problem of unemployment there were no actual cases of distress reported.

It was the feeling of the meeting that the city should provide work during the winter months. There was criticism of the Government Bureau here, formerly in charge of a returned man, having been closed, and the work turned over to a bureau in charge of an official appointed during the war, and one whose sympathies are not with the returned soldiers. Col. M. A. Colquhoun, D.S.O., C.M.G., was decided to have all returned men out of employment register with Secretary of the G. W. V. A. during the week.

## HEARING OF CHARGES AGAINST LONDON MAN NOT YET COMPLETED

Prosecution and Defence Have Long List of Witnesses Ready.

## CHARGED WITH THEFT

Defence May Prove Prisoner Was Not Connected With Robbery.

ST. THOMAS, Dec. 19.—The charge against Allan Hewitt, London, of the theft of goods from a car on the L. and P. S. R. was not concluded at the adjourned sitting of the general session yesterday noon, when the court adjourned until Monday morning.

It is possible that the defence may prove that, although Hewitt was on the ground at the moment when the men in the auto got away from the police, that Hewitt was not there with a criminal intent, but rather as a curious onlooker.

About 20 witnesses have been subpoenaed by the crown, and Hewitt has a long list on his behalf. The more important evidence was given by Fred North, night janitor of the M. C. R., who swore that he had quit his work about 2:45 a.m. on the morning of the robbery, and had started home on his bicycle. Arriving at Brook Street he had found the huge collection of merchandise strewn along the tracks, and had hurried back and notified Sgt. Ketchabaw. The witness stated that he then returned to the Barwick street bridge on his bicycle, and waited until Constable McKeown and Small arrived. He had returned to the goods with the constables, and had found further merchandise piled up against the fence at the top of the bank.

Identifies Prisoner. The witness described hiding in the grass with the constables, and of seeing four men walk down the railway tracks from the city and stop beside the mer-

received had come to him by telephone about 4 o'clock in the morning, and he had immediately gone and examined the goods found along the tracks, and checked them off with the freight bills. The witness demonstrated a car-door sealing machine for the benefit of the jury, and showed how the door of the pilfered car had undoubtedly been opened. He swore that the ordinary concussion of the railroad would not be sufficient to burst a car door open. He also exhibited an iron lever that he had found in the car.

Alfred Cox of London, a motorman on the L. and P. S. R., testified that he was the driver of the engine that had drawn the train in question on the night of July 8. He told of stopping at West-

minster about ten minutes, and of seeing two strange men alight from a passenger train and cross in front of his locomotive. They had gone up the west side of the freight train a short distance, and had then returned and had gone up the east side of his train. He had been unable to identify the men.

Mr. Cox told Mr. McEvoy that the average speed of his train had been about 40 miles an hour. He did not remember exactly where the train had stopped on the Wahash diamond.

Constables McKeown and Small, who charged the men in the auto and arrested the prisoner, have not yet testified.
