RESTIGOUCHE MAKES NEW WORLD'S RECORD

Wins New Rochelle Stakes at Belmont Park—Seven Furlongs in 1.31 1-5.

NEW YORK, May 29.—James R. Keene's Restigouche, 106 pounds up, the even money favorite, easily won the New Rochelle Stakes at Belmont Park to-day and in doing so made a new world's record for the distance, seven and a half furlongs, by stepping it in 1.31 1-5. The time is 4-5 of a second faster than the best previous time, held jointly by Dainty and Welbourne, Dainty ran the distance at Oakland, Cal., on Dec. 19, 1904, in 1.32 1-5, while Welbourne at this track in 1906, equaled 1.32.

Restigouche went to the front at the start and led by one length to the stretch. Here he drew away to win by one and a half lengths. Rockstone was second, with Zenap third.
