HUCKLE GUILTY, TIERNY FREE, BLACKMAIL CHARGE

Claimed to Have Evidence Against Ireland and Brydges—Dr. Dillabaugh Stricken.

HAMILTON, Dec. 11.—(Special.)—Wm. Huckle, who styles himself a private detective, and John Tierney were placed on trial at to-day's sessions on a charge of blackmail laid by George Ireland and James Brydges. The jury went out at 7 o'clock and at a returned verdict of guilty in the case of Huckle, but they acquitted Tierney. They wished to hear some of the evidence read over in connection with Huckle. At 10 o'clock they announced that they had found Tierney not guilty, but they stood 9 for and 3 against a verdict of guilty in the Huckle case. Judge Snyder sent them back and told them unless they came in with a verdict by 12 o'clock they would be locked up for the night. At 11 o'clock the jury brought in a verdict of guilty with a strong recommendation to mercy. Ireland and Brydges testified that Huckle and Tierney said they had evidence against them on the charge of committing an assault on Alce Cox. Dr. Dillabaugh was seized with an apoplectic stroke to-night and was taken to the City Hospital. No hope of his recovery is entertained.

Mr. Cowper asked for a remand to bring the surviving members of the party of Chinese from Buffalo to Welland to identify the prisoners.
