APPLES BECOMING EXTREMELY SCARCE

Choice Greenings Sold Yesterday at Seven Dollars a Barrel.

HOT-HOUSE RHUBARB

Arrives in Large Quantities Each Day and Has Already Sale.

Choice apples have been hard to secure all season, and are daily becoming scarcer as the season advances. One of the best crops of Greenings seen on the market this year, however, came in yesterday from Dixon Bros. of Hamilton to McWilliam & Everist, No. 1 grade selling at the high price of \$6.50 to \$7 per barrel.

Hot-house rhubarb is beginning to come in a little more freely. It is of choice quality, and sells readily at \$1.25 per dozen bunches.

Florida celery came on the market yesterday, selling at \$4.25 per case. Florida tomatoes also came in and were of splendid quality. They sold at the high price of \$7, \$8 and \$9 per dozen bunches.

McWilliam & Everist had a car of Nova Scotia, Spry apples, selling at \$6.50 to \$7 per barrel—a shipment of Florida tomatoes at \$9 per six-bushel crate. Hot-house cucumbers at \$2.50 per dozen; new beets at \$1 per dozen; a car of bananas at \$2 to \$2.50 per hundred.

A. A. McKinnon had a car of yellow Danvers onions, selling at \$4.25 per ton; a car of New Brunswick Delawares potatoes, selling at \$2.75 per bag; a car of British Columbia tomatoes, selling at \$2.25 per bushel.

M. Peters had a shipment of Florida tomatoes, selling at \$7 to \$8 per six-bushel crate.
