GENERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS, HINTS, ETC.—Continued

A letter delivered to a wrong person, from any cause whatever, should be at once returned to the Post Office, and if it has been opened, the party who opened it should write on the cover—"Opened by me through mistake" and sign his name thereto.

Examine all correspondence before mailing, to see that it is properly addressed and prepaid, if any doubt exists as to the latter enquire at the Post Office wicket.

No information can be given respecting letters which pass through a Post Office, except to the sender or the person to whom they are addressed.

Parties changing their residence, or who desire to have their correspondence re-directed, should inform the Postmaster in writing, stating their old as well as their new address.

The only "request" letters that can be recognized are those originating within the Dominion, Newfoundland or United States and addressed to places in these countries.

Stamps should be affixed to letters on the right hand upper corner of the face or address side.

To attempt to use any stamp that has previously served for payment of postage is by law made an offence punishable by fine, and to remove marks of cancellation for the purpose of using such a stamp a second time is by law a misdemeanor, punishable by fine or imprisonment or both. No mutilated stamp can be accepted in payment of postage, nor should any soiled stamp be used.

All matter produced by the type-writer is subjected to letter rate of postage.
