

MINIATURE TREES

Simple Plan by Which Plants May Be Dfarfed in the Growing For many centuries the Japanese have closely guarded the secret of growing miniature trees. Indeed, until recently, they did not allow the trees to be taken out of the country; wealthy people keep them as art treasures. Now, in America, dwarf trees bring a good price, and are used as house plants and table decorations. By following the plan here described almost any one can raise diminutive trees with little trouble.

Get a few large, thick skinned oranges

Get a few large, thick skinned oranges and halve them. Remove the pulp and cover the outside of the skins with thick shellac. That will keep the skins from shrivelling. Fill the skins with fine, rich soil and plant therein a seed of whatever tree you wish to raise—or rather two or three seeds, to insure at least one good specimen.
