HISTORICAL CARNIVAL.
Armies of William and Harold March Through Hastings.

London, May 22.—(By Mail).—An historical and carnival procession, one and a half miles in length, took place at the opening of the second day's festivities of the Hastings and St. Leonards Whitenside carnival yesterday. Chief interest was shown in the historical section. William the Conqueror and King Harold, with their armies marched through Hastings, together with men of the Stone Age and Ancient Britons. During the afternoon the ancient history of the town was re-enacted with the Battle of Hastings, followed by a Norman tournament at the White Rock Gardens. The festivities concluded with a fancy dress dance.

BRITISH BANKS CAN BARE ACCOUNTS, COURT DECLARES
London, June 5.—(By Mail).—The case in which was raised the question

of the right of a bank to disclose facts respecting the account of a customer ended in the King's Bench Division (before Mr. Justice Avory and a common jury) in judgment for the defendants — the National Provincial and Union Bank of England, Limited.

Mr. Justice Avory, in summing up, said there was no absolute contract by a bank not to disclose the state of a person's account to another, says The London Daily News report. If a banker made such a disclosure reasonably and justifiably there was no breach of contract. The question here was whether the disclosure was made on a reasonable and proper occasion.

NEW PEARL VALUED AT \$60,000.
Sydney, N. S. W., May 26.—(A. P. by mail).—The discovery at Broome of a pearl of 102 grains, of double-button shape, is reported by the chief pearling inspector of West Australia.

The pearl, which is valued at \$60,000, surpasses the famous "Star of the West," which weighed 101 grains and was valued at \$50,000.

AUSTRIA ONCE EXPELLED
MUSOLINI AS AGITATOR

Italian Premier Recently Informed Before War Ban on Him is Lifted.

London, June 8.—(By Mail).—A few years before the outbreak of war Signor Benito Mussolini was editor of a Socialist journal at Trent, in South Tyrol, until one day he was expelled from Austria as a troublesome foreigner, says the Vienna correspondent of The London Morning Post. The Italian Premier did not forget this incident, for when not long ago Chancellor Seipel met him in Milan he remarked smilingly to his visitor that he could not return the visit without an annulment of his expulsion. It is a matter of course that Dr. Seipel on his return from Italy took the necessary measures, and it is stated today that Signor Mussolini has been informed through the Austrian Minister in Rome that his expulsion has been cancelled.

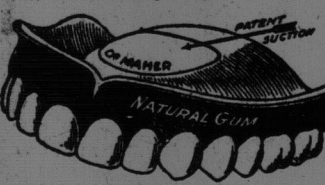

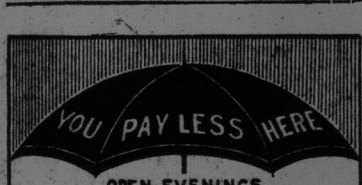

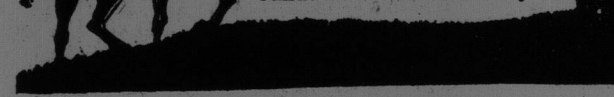
