HISTORY OF N. S. CONSTITUENCIES

Kings County, the Home of Evangeline, Birthplace of Sir Robert Borden—Some New Men in the Field.

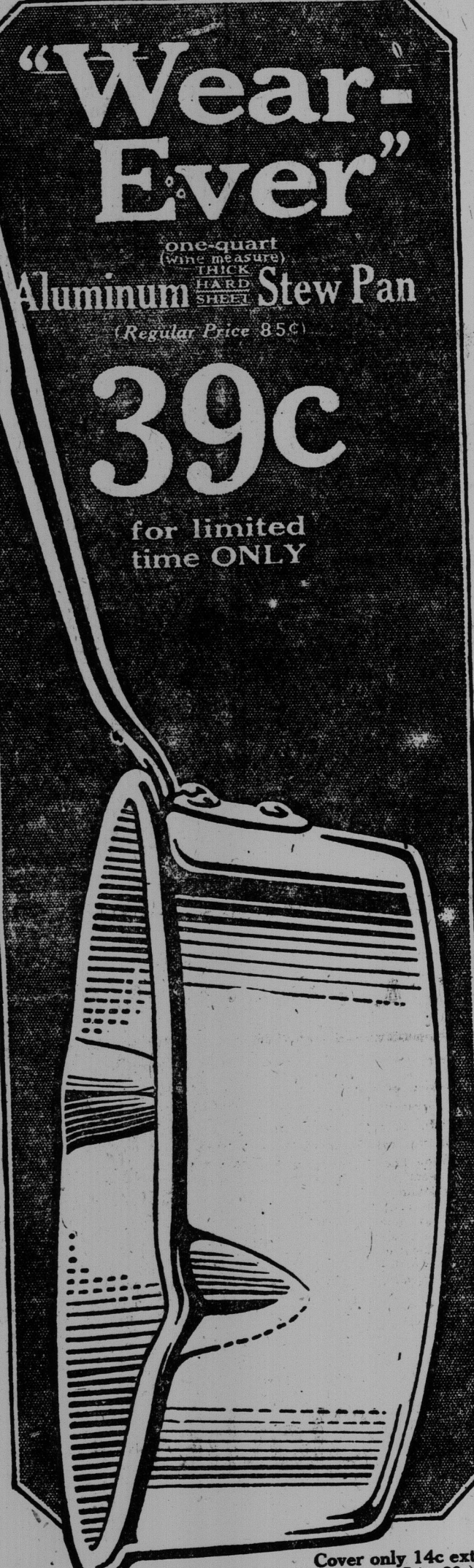
settled by the Acadians, were the forests primeval; here Evangeline, the mythical maiden immortalized by the New England bard, watched the turgid tides of the Basin of Minas or the mists about the bow of Blomidon. Later the people of British descent cut down the forests primeval and built ships which were famous in the ports of all the seas. More recently the inhabitants have replaced the forest primeval with extensive apple orchards.

Grand Pre, Kings county, was the birthplace of Sir Robert Borden, leader of the Canadian government during the war. When the Union government was formed in 1917, Sir Robert stood for his native county, being elected by a large majority. Kings also had a representative in the Laurier government—Sir Frederick Borden, minister of militia. In the present election the candidates are H. W. Phinney, government, and Ernest Robinson, Liberal, both successful men new to federal politics.

Colchester, N. S.

Colchester county, N. S., has helped make political history. In the first confederation government formed by Sir John A. Macdonald in 1867, Adam George Archibald of Truro was secretary of state for the provinces, but in the general elections of that year he was beaten in Gloucester by A. W. McLean, the Liberal leader. Though he had been one of the first to advocate confederation, Howe bitterly opposed the arrangements offered by Sir John A. Macdonald and accepted by Sir Charles Tupper, leader of the Nova Scotia government, and after the elections which gave the anti-confederates seventeen out of thirty-eight seats in the provincial assembly, Howe held the province in the hollow of his hand and started a fight with the federal government for better terms for Nova Scotia, a fight in which McLean played an important role.

In 1869, Sir John A. Macdonald having offered the province more favorable terms, Howe accepted an appointment in the dominion government, and McLean being made a senator and also one of the four commissioners appointed to build

the Intercolonial Railway, resigned his seat. Archibald stood again for Colchester and was elected, but only by the exercise of all the influence possessed by McLean, who was head of one of the big ship owning and shipbuilding firms of the province.

In 1870, Archibald was appointed first lieutenant-governor of the new Province of Manitoba.

In 1881, McLean became president of the Canadian cabinet, and in the following year was appointed minister of marine and fisheries, when he resigned from the senate and was elected for Colchester. Later, McLean was appointed lieutenant-governor of the province, and, like several other Nova Scotia governors, died at the government house, Halifax.

The results of dominion general elections in Colchester since confederation follow:

In 1867, A. W. McLean, L.; 1872, F. H. Pearson, L.; in 1874 and 1878, Thos. McKay, C.; 1882 and 1887, A. W. McLean, C.; 1891, W. A. Patterson, C.; 1896, W. D. Dinwiddie, C.; 1900, S. Gosselin, C.; 1904, F. A. Lawrence, L.; 1908, B. McCurdy, then head of the brokerage firm of F. B. McCurdy & Co., was elected by acclamation as a Conservative.
