RECENT DEATHS

George H. Trueman.
Moncton, N. B., Feb. 27—(Special)—The death of George H. Trueman occurred at his residence, 118 Weldon street, Wednesday night. The deceased was eighty-one years of age and leaves behind him a wife, Mrs. Mary A. Trueman, formerly Miss Mary Shaw, Annapolis (N. S.). Deceased was born at St. John's, Newfoundland, and lived in St. John several years before moving to his residence in Moncton, where he was a well known contractor on the R. for many years and later stationer at Moncton. Mr. Trueman was a genial citizen of splendid quality and had many friends not only in

Moncton and St. John where he lived the greater part of his life, but throughout the province. Mr. Trueman retired from active life about ten years ago and for some two years past he has been in failing health. He was a prominent mason and a member of Central Methodist church.

Mrs. Rebecca Evans.
Moncton, Feb. 27—(Special)—Mrs. John Yeager, Moncton, received word this morning of the death of her sister, Mrs. Rebecca Evans, widow of Fred Evans at her residence, Lynn (Mass.), February 24. Deceased, who was sixty-eight years of age was formerly Miss Rebecca O'Neil and was born at Dover (N. B.). Her husband died about

twenty-three years ago when they were residents of Moncton. Mrs. Evans then removed to Lynn where she has since resided with her son, George. She leaves behind her son, two brothers, Bannister O'Neil, of Lynn and Clifford O'Neil, Salisbury. Three sisters also survive, Mrs. Margaret Marsh, Lynn, Mrs. Nancy Thompson and Mrs. John Yeager, Moncton.

Mrs. Elizabeth Woodlock.
Moncton, N. B., Feb. 27—(Special)—Mrs. Ellen Woodlock, widow of E. D. Woodlock, for more than forty years a resident of Pugwash, passed away today at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. Frank O'Rourke, Moncton. The deceased was born at Joggins Mines in 1835. She is survived by two sons, Chas. E., of Pugwash, Patrick A., of Calgary, one daughter, Mrs. Frank O'Rourke, with whom she had made her home for the past three years.

Louis Gordon Glass, advocate, whose death was announced in the Times a few days ago, was born at Woodstock, N. B., on May 22, 1857. His father was the late Rev. Charles Gordon Glass, M. A., of Laurenceville, Kinross-shire, Scotland, who was the founder of Glassville, N. B., which place was originally settled by Scotch families brought out by him from Scotland. He also founded the Woodstock College, of which he was the principal, and he was the leading figure in pioneer Presbyterian work in this province. For many years the late Rev. Mr. Glass was the resident pastor in Prince William, York county, and his wife was a sister of the late Mrs. John Scott.

The late Louis Gordon Glass was admitted to the bar on July 9, 1895, and practiced his profession for some years as a member of the firm of Greenshields, Greenshields, Lafamme and Glass, Montreal, and, previous to his death, he was a member of the firm of Rivet, Glass and Sullivan.

He had married the youngest daughter of the late Frederick T. Judah, K. C., of Montreal, and, besides his wife, is survived by three children, also his brother, Charles G. Glass, and three sisters, Mrs. J. N. Greenshields, Mrs. William Reed and Miss May Glass.

Hon. Charles Henry Emerson, K. C., a former member of the Morris government of Newfoundland, died in Boston recently from pneumonia. W. A. Simpson, station agent at Amherst, and Mrs. Simpson came here to meet the body.

Frank F. Knorr died on Feb. 15 at his home in Mill Settlement. He is survived by his wife, two sons and one daughter. He was born in St. John and was forty-four years of age.

STEAMER MEGANTIC IS DUE AT HALIFAX MARCH 5.

Ottawa, Feb. 27—The White Star Dominion liner Megantic, which is expected to arrive at Halifax on March 5, has forty-seven officers and 1,123 other ranks on board, of whom five officers and 131 other ranks are for Montreal, thirty-five other ranks for Quebec, and five officers and 110 other ranks for Halifax.

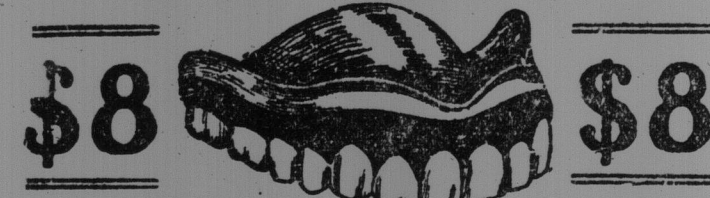
