SAYS GERMAN SCIENTIST
Berlin, Sept. 22.—Dr. Kunert, one of
the highest authorities on food analysis,
considers that black rye bread should
be the chief item of nourishment of
healthy men and women, and maintains

classes did not eat next to any extent
but nourished themselves on black bread,
leguminous food and groats, they were
full of pith, and were strong and
healthy.

became the staples of daily fare their
power of resisting disease has sunk.
