### LUNATIC POINTS

**OUT ANOTHER AS**  
**MISSING BROTHER**

Identification Occurred at Sun-  
day Service in Munico Asy-  
lum—Relatives Thought He  
Had Perished in Fernie Fire.

Toronto, Oct. 15—A dramatic incident  
is reported from Munico Asylum for the  
Insane. At a religious service held on
