

CANADIAN WOMAN IN SENSATIONAL SUICIDE

Miss Marie Hugo Believed to be One Who Threw Herself Under Engine in New York Town

Binghamton, N. Y., April 6.—The Binghamton police authorities have received a message from Toronto asking for information regarding Marie Hugo, the woman who last Monday committed suicide under an engine. Mrs. Hugo, of 8 Monteth Street, Toronto, believes the woman was her daughter, and the police believe that the victim's home was in Toronto, from an address found among her papers.

For two years the woman had lived here under the name of Sadie Sylvester. She was employed in a cloak establishment. She was of a religious turn of mind, and of late had appeared to be in a thoughtful mood. Last Monday she left her boarding place for the place of business where she was employed but went to the depot and lay down in front of a freight engine. Two employees riding on the locomotive tried in vain to rescue her and say that as the wheels went over her she looked up and smiled in their face. When taken practically mangled from the track she gasped, smiled again at her rescuers and expired. Toronto, April 6.—All the facts would seem to indicate that the woman suicide in Binghamton was a daughter of Mrs. Richard Hugo, who lives with her daughters at 8 Monteth Street.

The Hugo claim to be the direct descendants of Victor Hugo, the French author, and say they have a copy of the family tree showing the lineage.

MAINE DRIVES WILL BE LATE IN STARTING

(Bangor Commercial).

If there is any class of business men wondering when spring is really going to show up, it is in the lumbermen. Present weather conditions indicate a late start of the drives and unless there is a decided and remarkable change in the weather within the next week or two, it will be the last of April or the first of May before a single log can be even started on the first leg to the booms.

Usually the lumbermen figure on starting their logs from the landing about the middle of April. This is about the average date, although last year it was in March that the drives were started. This spring, however, it is going to be a different proposition. The ice in the lakes and streams is very thick at the present time and with freezing weather, as has been experienced in most up-river sections, the lumbermen in depth instead of melting. Coupled with a heavy depth of ice, is the low condition of the water.

Lumbermen figure that it will take several weeks of very warm and summerish weather to start the ice melting and moving to the lakes. April is already here and there is no sign at the present time that warm weather is coming. It is at least long enough to start anything in the way of driving logs.

While there may be a delayed start of the drives of three or four weeks, perhaps longer, operators are hoping that with a good supply of snow in the woods and ice in the lakes and streams there will be a good head of water to hurry the logs along once they get started. There is about three feet of snow in the woods on an average and when this is melted it is expected to produce quite a body of water. With a good supply of water, the lumbermen think that their logs will not be very late in arriving at the lower booms, even should the start be delayed several weeks.

Notwithstanding the fact that present indications are against a start of the drives before the last of the present month or the first of May, many of the lumbermen are sending their driving crews into the woods now. They want to get the work of the men and prefer to keep them in camp at considerable expense rather than be obliged to put up with an inferior bunch of drivers. With the drive some weeks off, the men can be employed about the landings and in some cases at lumbering.

When this spring are about as usual, and range from \$1.50 to \$1.75 a day, although some of the operators are not averse to paying \$3 if they can get hold of men they know to be exceptionally able on the drive. Such men, however, are not to be found any minute and the \$3 wage does not grow on every bush.




