ISAACS WELLS'S ARREST

Strong Evidence Against Isaac, who had long been supposed to be a Tramp in the State Prison—Blood in the Bug-77—Arrested.

The mysterious disappearance of Hiram F. Savitt, of Boston, on February 5th, is being investigated by the Boston police.

On Feb. 14, Isaac went to Rochester, N. H., taking his mother and Hiram's seven-year-old daughter with him.
