TRAGEDIES OF NEW YEAR'S.

REIGN OF THE DRUNKARD AND THE "TOMMY" IN NEW YORK.

Several Cases of Fatal Assaults with Stones and Pistols in a Most Street-Fanatic and Unusually Blood-Thirsty Night and Assaults in Various Parts.

New York, Jan. 1, 1889. Cornelius O'Connor, a young laborer, while walking on Elizabeth street soon after midnight this morning, was struck on the head and had his skull fractured with a brick thrown by some unknown member of the Elizabeth street gang of roughs, who were slinking and fighting in the neighborhood.

John Neary, a laborer aged 22 years, while standing before the tenement 341 Tenth avenue where he lived with his family was shot through the heart and killed on the spot.

A farmer who had taken a farm near Balltown, from which the tenants had been evicted, was shot by four men and brutally murdered yesterday.

Work on the Montreal ice palace was begun yesterday.

There is a rumor that the position held by Mr. Dewey and that occupied by the late Cunningham Stewart will be abolished.

House on the Orléans estate in Bonaparte was barricaded by the tenants.

By a fall yesterday afternoon, Sergeant Brown, of Fredericton, had his left arm broken.

It is said that a recent letter in the English and Scotch papers, referring to the difficulty between the French and the English, was written by Rev. Mr. Dar- ton, of Newcastle.

On Sunday morning Lewis Horner, a Chicago grocer, arrived in Montreal on 231 East Eighth-street street.

The largest strike ever known in the United States is threatened by the Ballway Brotherhood, if the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Co. refuse to accede to the demands now placed before them.

Miss Mary A. McKeen, sister of Mrs. K. J. Burns dropped dead while attending mass at Immaculate last Monday.

On Sunday morning the management of a lottery recently drawn for the benefit of the St. Andrew's parish church, Glasgow, has just returned to Scotland from Fort St. J. Egyp, after having ridden on his bicycle to London, Paris, Switzerland, the Tyrol, the Austrian States, Servia, and Bulgaria, to Constantinople, thence into Asia Minor by Kutahia, Konia, and Taurus to the north of Syria, encountering extremely wet and stormy weather in the north of Syria, to Jaffa, Mr. Callan rode into Jerusalem, where he was halted at the Hotel Royal, where he had entered the place. From Jerusalem the journey was continued to Fort St. J. The total distance travelled being about 2,700 miles. Mr. Callan was absent for four months. He is a native of Ayr.
