Now the great body of people appear to feel that when the critical time arrives they are more likely to get help from the liberal or radical party than from the conservatives. This belief will have more or less effect on all future electioneering contests, especially in a general election.

RETURNING TO THE FOLD.

Another change which is pasaing over political parties is this. The dissentient liberals are gradually making their way back to the regular fold. I do not see how this can be doubted by those who study the field attentively. Yet the conservative leaders do not seem to be aware of it. It will make a vast difference to them if this tendency goes on.

A strike was begun yesterday in the Louisville and Nashville freight yards at Evansville, Indiana. It is feared to be the beginning of a general strike on the Louisville, and Mackay systems.

The Government bonds stolen recently in Mexico had a face value of \$1,250,000. They were signed by the secretary of the treasury but lacked the treasurer's signorm as second story window yesterday morning and was instantly killed.

The moulders at Pittsburg, Pa., struck for ten per cent advance yesterday. A number of the employers have conceded the terms and it is expected others will follow.

The Allans have ordered three new freight boats to be built in the Clydee, so good is the shipping business from the St. Lawrence. The first is to be ready morning and was instantly killed.
