



Stephens, chairman of the Montreal harbor commission, who returned from Europe today, annonneed that work on the new Montreal harbor schemes will be started at once and will en-tail an annual expenditure of \$1,500-000 for four years. The first work to be undertaken will be the raising of the Victoria pier from a low to a bigh level which will give accommodation for 25 instead of 20 ocean vessels, the building of an upper level railway for a distance of seven miles eastwards to eventually be continued around the whole island and the dredging of portions of the harbor. arbor. London, April 18.—The Atlantic Transport Line steamer Minnehnha is ashore at Scilly, user Bishop's Rock, according to a wireless message re-ceived from her at Lloyd's Signal Sta-tion at the Lizard at 2:10 this morn-ing. The Lloyd's has wired to Fal-mouth for assistance. The wreck is west, light, with dense fog. April 18.—(4 a.m.)—The Minnehaha's passengers are now being landed. The captain remains with the ship. New York April 17.—The Minne-haha sailed from New York on April 9 with sixty-one cabin passengers. Among them was Frederick Keppel of this city. The Minnehaha is a cargo-rative of 13,443 tons with accom-modations for cabin passengers only, he was built in Befrast in 1900. The capital is fred.
