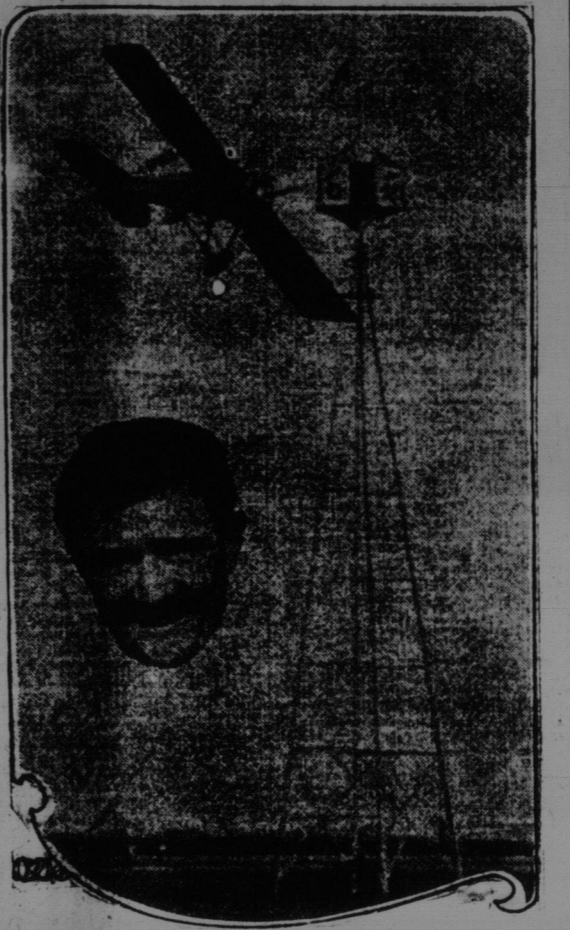

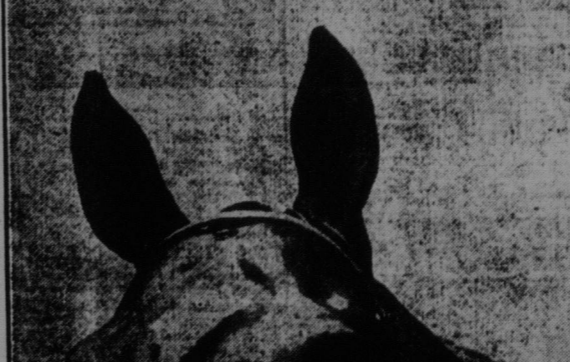
FRENCH AVIATOR IN GREAT FLIGHT THAT WON GORDON BENNETT CUP RACE
