ANOTHER SHIPMENT OF GOLD TO CANADA

New York, Oct. 10—All the banks which participated in the underwriting of the \$100,000,000 loan to the city of New York, having responded promptly to the call for payment of the third instalment of their subscriptions, Messrs, J. P. Morgan & Co. and Messrs. Kuhn, Loeb & Co., as the syndicate managers, yesterday shipped more gold to Ottawa to be placed to the credit of the Bank of England. The amount of coin they sent from the Sub-Treasury was \$3,750,000. That was not the only gold, however, shipped to Canada yesterday. In all, the shipments amounted to \$4,005,000. Of that sum \$255,000 was in coin taken by two Canadian banks and two New York houses, and \$450,000 was in bars shipped from the Assay Office.

With yesterday's shipment Messrs. J. P. Morgan & Co. have exported about \$15,000,000 gold on account of the \$88,000,000 of obligations the city of New York had to meet abroad between September last and January next.
