Published in the great Lumbering and Fishing centre of North-
ern New Brunswick. Twelve sawmills, two sulphite pulp
mills, also spoil, block and crate mills within a radius of six
miles. Transatlantic shipments of sawn lumber average 120
million ft. per year. Over four thousand tons of fish are shipped
annually from Miramichi Railway Stations. Chatham is the
Eastern terminus of the Canada Eastern Railway and is connected
with the Intercolonial Railway by a branch twelve miles in length.
The Advance is largely circulated in Counties of Northumber-
land, Kent, Gloucester and Restigouche, Province of New Brun-
swick and in Bonaventure and Gaspé, Quebec.
