

DISCUSS PLANS FOR NEW CHURCH HOME

King Street Presbyterians
Will Delay Building Until
Next Year.

Although no action will be taken for another year at least by the members of the King Street Presbyterian Church regarding the building of a new church or the remodeling of the present building, two propositions discussed at a meeting called for the purpose on Wednesday night, will be laid before the board of managers for consideration. The report will be brought in by the members of the board, and some action will then be taken.

It was first proposed that the present building should be remodeled. It was planned that a 2-story extension should be built at the rear and adjoining the present structure. The addition containing two large rooms, 37 feet by 19 feet each, separated by great folding doors would house the Sunday school. By moving the Sunday school to this building, the basement of the church proper would be used entirely as a gymnasium.

Pipe Organ Proposed.
It was also planned that the choir loft should be enlarged and a new pipe organ installed. That new desks should be placed in the church, and that the remodeling of the present building should be delayed until the next year. It was thought that by putting a new front in the church the appearance would be improved. The seating capacity of the building would be increased by 75. Plans drawn up showing the proposed changes were laid before the meeting by W. G. Murray, secretary. He estimated that the cost of erecting a full modern Sunday school as proposed would be somewhere in the neighborhood of \$15,000. It was believed that the changes to the front of the church would cost \$3,400, and the organ \$8,000. The whole would cost, it was estimated, at \$20,000.

Sell Dundas Property.
The other plan was that an entirely new building should be erected on a site a few blocks east of the present location. It was believed that the supporters of the present site for church purposes would not warrant an expenditure of \$20,000. It was estimated that a new church could be erected at cost somewhere under \$50,000. Members of the church believe that \$50,000 could be raised for building purposes by the end of the present year. Rev. W. R. McIntosh thought that the congregation owed it to the young people of the church to carry the burden of the balance.

HEAVY LOSS BY PRICE-FIXING

Costs Ontario Apple Growers
Millions Each Year,
Says Preston.

TORONTO, March 9.—Establishment by the Ontario Government of warehouses in England for storage, sorting and sale of exported Ontario apples was formally advocated by W. T. R. Preston, Port Hope, today before the special committee of the Legislature appointed to deal with marketing and export of fruit products. Preston said that the Ontario growers received only \$1.50 per barrel for apples, while the retail price for apples in England was from \$3 to \$5 per barrel. British consumers paid \$20,000,000 annually for Canadian apples, the cost of which, f.o.b. Liverpool, was not more than \$6,000,000.

BOARD OF EDUCATION MUST CUT \$100,000 FROM ESTIMATES

No. 1 Committee Hands Out
Ultimatum.

RUTHLESS SLASHING
To Keep Down Tax Rate Is
Carried Out by Councilors.

An ultimatum to the board of education to cut \$100,000 from its estimates or collect its own taxes came as a surprise to the members of the board of education. The proposed expenditures of other city departments by No. 1 committee of the city council last night. More than \$90,000, or two mills, was struck from the figures as originally drawn up.

No salary increases in any departments were allowed. The only unusual expenditure approved was that to add fifteen men to the police force. After drastic reductions had been made in all other estimates the committee faced those of the board of education totalling \$777,223, an increase of 30 per cent or \$183,944 over last year and requiring a tax rate of 12 1/2 mills. The board of education, however, is not going to raise the money. Existing legislation prevents the city council from amending the board of education estimates.

Collect Its Own Taxes.
"If we can't do anything with these figures, we let the board collect its own taxes," said Mayor Little. "We have managed to reduce our estimates, but they have taken advantage of the increase in assessment and are asking a higher mill rate, as well. They increased salaries in the face of decrease of living costs. The assessment now is \$2,000,000 with the annexed district greatly under-assessed. When they come in we may find our per capita assessment too high. We have got to be careful. We have only the limit of our tax rate. The board of education can help to relieve some of the burden on the people if they use common business judgment."

Save Facts to People.
Ald. Cameron Wilson said the facts should be brought before the people to make some real sense out of the situation. G. W. HOFFER IS ELECTED PRESIDENT OF R. E. COUNCIL

Speakers Deplore Neglect of
Family Worship—Movies
in Vogue.

G. W. Hoffer was made president of the London Religious Educational Council at the final session of the annual meeting held yesterday in Wellington Street Methodist Church. Mr. Hoffer, who has been active in this organization since its inception, fills the vacancy left by Rev. W. J. Knox, who died recently.

Education in the Home.
Rev. C. A. Myers and Rev. T. A. Halpenny were the special speakers at the closing session. Mr. Myers speaking on "Education in the Home." "The average home is a failure as regards teaching religion to young children, and there is not adequate time in the Sunday school for sufficient training along religious lines. The situation is black, though there is a bright side to the blackness in that there are more than ever before," said the speaker. "It is an entirely wrong thing for the Sunday school to be relied upon for the religious education of the young people. We must face this drift from family prayer and Bible reading, and put into operation some program that will bring back the family unity. That average home is ready to try out any practical plan that is suggested to it. The first step is to get back to the simple life and the simple home. Instead of going to the movies, homes in these modern days should be places of prayer, sleeping and boarding place. We must take this situation, and permeate the atmosphere of the home with the atmosphere of the family altar."

The family altar, went out of existence because it was left to an individual to do all the praying and Bible reading instead of every member of the family taking part. Sunday evenings should be spent with the child or children at their home, and the Bible story gone over so that it will be impressed upon the child's memory. The time to start to educate the child religiously is from the moment of its birth. Everybody is anxious to raise No. 1 horses, and other things. Why not children? A child cannot be a No. 1 child unless his spiritual needs are looked after as much as his bodily needs."
