DOMINION OF CANADA.

LIST of Acts reserved for Her Majesty's pleasure since Confederation, 1867, which have not received Her Majesty's Assent.

TITLES and Dates of Acts and of Reserved Bills and of Acts with Suspending Clauses passed by the Legislatures of *Upper Canada, Lower Canada, Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick*, from 1836 to the Confederation of the Provinces 1867, and by the Legislature of *Prince Edward's Island* from 1837 to the entrance of that Province into the Canadian Union 1873, and by the Legislatures of Newfoundland and of the several Australian Colonies, New Zealand, Tasmania, and the Cape of Good Hope, which have not received Her Majesty's Assent or have been disallowed.

UPPER CANADA.

1839 An Act to dispose of the lands commonly called "Clergy Reserves," and for other purposes therein mentioned	Not assented to -	Not now law.
1839 An Act to appropriate the casual and territorial revenue, and for other purposes therein mentioned	- - ditto -	- ditto.
1839 An Act to regulate the value at which gold and silver coin shall pass current within their Province	- - ditto -	Currency is now regulated by the Dominion Parliament
1839 An Act to ascertain and provide for the payment of all just claims arising from the late rebellion and invasion of the Province	- - ditto -	Not now law

* Note—It should be stated that some of the Acts in this Return were unobjectionable, except as to one or more clauses, and in such cases the third column should be read as relating to those clauses only
