Wildcats suspended

Two Westwood Secondary School senior basketball players have been suspended from school for one week because of their roles in a fight during the third quarter of a Dec. 14 game with Bramalea at Westwood.

Westwood principal Tim Costigan suspended Earl

Dixon and Lasalles DaCosta Dec. 18, following a meeting with the two players, Rob Bazzo, another team member involved in the incident, senior coach Don MacCahill and junior coach Mal Simms. Costigan also reviewed the referee's report.

Costigan also removed Dixon from the team for

the remainder of the season and DaCosta for one month. Bazzo received the minimum one game suspension called for by the Peel Secondary School Athletic Association in the case of an ejection from a game.

According to the referees report, Bramalea's Gary Kynoch was fouled by Bazzo.

When he tried to get up Bazzo pushed him. A scuffle broke out and Dixon jumped in and repeatedly tried to get at Kynoch.

Kynoch and teammate Norm Pfennig were also ejected from the game and suspended for Bramalea's next game.

Bramalea, leading 67-21 at the time of the incident went on to win the game 93-33.

Titans coach calls it quits

Port Credit Titan coach Jim Wright, who was saddled with the general manager's duties when John Hanafin quit early in the season, has quit the team.

Titans owners Frank Gentile of Titan Cartage and John Tyson were both surprised at Wright's decision and had hoped he'd stay on as general manager.

Ken Southwick, who handled Titans' Thursday

night practice, has been hired as coach. Southwick came to Titans, said Gentile, "on the highest recommendation of Curly Davies who is with the Toronto Marlboros in some capacity."

Titans, who are in last place in the Metro Junior B league east division in their first season of play, are affiliated with Marlies and the Provincial Junior A Markham Waxers. They play their home games Saturday nights at Meadowvale Four Rinks.

"I'm just tired of doing both jobs," said Wright who spent 10 years in the Royal York minor hockey association before coming to Titans this year. "I never wanted both jobs in the first place."

Wright said instead of receiving help from the owners and the Marlies, he only received more and more duties.

"I started out as coach and now I spend three nights doing the program and my wife is on the door for games," he said.

"I didn't ask for

anything but I didn't ask to get slapped in the face."

The association with Waxers is an arrangement where the teams can share players. But, Wright said, even though he's only been able to ice nine players because of injuries, he received little help.

Titans defeated Oshawa 7-6 Tuesday in Oshawa in Wright's last game behind the bench.

Joe Francica, Randy Watlington and Adam Oates each scored twice for Titans and Steve Black added a single.

Trojans dominate northeast ball
