Laggon, June 17, 1906.

Dear Mr. Moon:

Since leaving Vancouver, I have thought so often of the kindness of yourself and other members of the Chinese Board of Trade, and of the great pleasure which the banquet given to the representatives of the Chinese Government afforded, that I would like to write to again express to you, and through you to the members of the Board, my deep appreciation of the many kindnesses received, and of the exceptional character of the occasion which brought us altogether in such a friendly way. The Fai See so kindly given to me by the Chinese Board of Trade as a memento of the banquet, will be cherished throughout my life. In your kind letter accompanying the gift, you very rightly refer to the international significance of the occasion. I hope it is but the first of many gatherings at which representatives of the great Empires of China and Great Britain may meet in this and other parts of the world to do honour to the friendship which exists between their respective peoples. Such a relationship preserved throughout the years to come should do much towards furthering the peace of the
