Dear Sir:

I have your letter of June 5th and wish to thank you very much indeed for your advice concerning my telegram of June 4th on the subject of the Pension Act Amendments and the effect of Order-in-Council dated May 21, 1940.

When I received copies of Hansard giving the House debate on the Bill I was surprised indeed to find that the question of the "dead spot" between May 21st and June 29th had not even been mentioned in the House debate. Possibly this is understandable because the Government would not, I presume, be overanxious to have the full significance of that action by Order-in-Council known to the public. Under the circumstances, you were the only one to whom I could appeal and notwithstanding the fact that you were unable to do anything, I wish to thank you very much indeed for your attention to this matter.
