I have the honor to inform you, in regard to the right of way taken by the Canadian Pacific Railway Co, through the Nistkaynehl Indian reserve in British Columbia, that Mr Mackay, the Agent of this Department, in that district, reports that there are four crossings used by the Indians living on this reserve, and that these crossings require to be planked flush with the rails, as in their present unfinished condition, the Indians are put to great inconvenience, and occasional damage to their vehicles. The Agent also reports that gates are required through the fencing
