
Ottawa, October 5, 1906.

Sir,-

Referring to your communication of the 28th August last, in regard to disposition of Lots 13 and 14 and the S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 15, Block Y, and Lot 15, Quarter Quinze Front, Temiscamingue, I beg to say that the surrender given by the Indians has been approved by His Excellency in Council, you may sell Lots 13 and 14 and S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 15, Block Y, to the Oblate Fathers, at the upset price of \$3.00 per acre, together with the sum of \$710.00, being the cost of the improvements, and you may sell Lot 15, Quarter Quinze Front, at \$3.00 per acre, cash, to Mr. [redacted]

The amount agreed to be paid for Indian improvements on Lots 13 and 14, Block Y, viz- \$690.00, and the amount agreed to be paid for improvements on S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Lot 15, Block Y, viz- \$20.00, should be collected and transmitted to the Department with your return of sale, and request made for cheques in the usual way.
