With Cheque, etc.,

Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 24th ultimo, with which you forwarded an account of \$53.00 from Dr Banting for vaccinating Indians of your Agency, and also an account of \$127.60 for services to Indians during January, February March and April last: and in reply I transmit herewith cheque No 16 for \$35.50 in payment of the account for vaccination.. With regard to the amount at which payment is made you should point out to the doctor that the Department allows only 50¢ per capita for each operation, and a mileage rate of 50¢ one way for the distance travelled.. The doctor is being paid \$9.00 for mileage and \$26.60 for the vaccination of 53 Indians

The other account is returned herewith, as evidently the doctor has charged for visits which were unnecessary, and in view of the statements made in the matter by John Thunder you should ask the doctor for an explanation.
