An ACT to ascertain and establish on a permanent footing, the Boundary Lines of the different Townships of this Province.

WHILEAS it is expedient and necessary, to ascertain and establish upon some permanent principle, the boundary lines of the different townships within this Province, and distinctly to preserve them when so ascertained and established, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, an act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, "an act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said province," and by the authority of the same, That stone monuments, or monuments of other durable materials, shall be placed at the several corners, governing points, or off sets of every township that hath been surveyed, or may hereafter be surveyed; and also, at each end of the several concession lines of such townships. And that lines from the monuments so erected, or to be erected, be taken and considered as the permanent boundary lines of such townships and concessions respectively.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the monuments above directed to be placed as aforementioned, shall be placed under the inspection and order of the Surveyor General of this Province.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid.

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
