REHEARSAL OF THE EGLINTON TOURNAMENT.—On Saturday, 90th July, there was a grand rehearsal, with tents and barriers, and the adjuncts of the lists. The knights first filted at the quintain figure, and then at the heavy block figure. The tilting practice, during which the men were only pertially in armoust—only Lord Alford and Lord Glenlyon, to the best of our seasible time, have insort helmels—was successful in jousts between two knights at a time, suage aspa-3-16. In full plate. The first succession of courses was between the Earl of Eginton, the Lord of the tournay—ind Lord Alford. The former was apparelled in a getgeous suit of burnished brass, with the dorsonet of his degree on his helmet; his plume and housings being of the colours of his livery, blue and gold. The latter was in bright steel, bearing on his helmet the creat of his name, with plume and housings of his proper tinetures, blue and white. The success of the joust was with Lord Alford, who planted one more attaint on the shield of his adversary than he himself suffered. After this Lord Glenlyon and Mr. Gage entered the lists; but even the beautiful horsemanship of the latter was unable to bring his horse up to the charge.
