A Profitable Cow

A profitable Cow A good example of what the Hol-stein cow will do in the hands of the sverage dary farmer is turnished by Mr. Fred. C. Clark, Victoria, P.E.I. Mr. Clark writes: "I am sending you the yearly milk record of Jacoba E., bred by Logan Bros, Amherst Point, N.S. We be-gan weighing March '90'b, 1005, and weighted every milking with the ex-ception of the week she spent at the "lait", which was estimated from pre-vious week. Regular samples of milk were taken from six or eight consecu-tive milkings and tested by our creamtive milkings and tested by our cream-ery man, from whose figures the amount of butter is taken. As correct an account as possible was kept of feed consumed, and when charged her at the following figures: roots \$2 per ton; hay \$10 per ton; grain and meal \$1 per hundred, and pasture and green St per hundred, and patture and green feed Sti for season, make a total cost of \$40.56. Her monthly amounts of milk were as follows: March 404, April 1231, May 1170, June 1092, July 1208, August 1170, Spretherber 1003, October 1221, November 701, Decem-ber 638, January 661, February 550, March 341; total 11,440 Ibs. milk and 515 lbs. estimated butter, Her milk at average price free init as sent, amounted to \$90.70, and the skim milk at 20 cents per hundred was worth \$30 worte, or a total of \$113.70, which, after deducting the cost of feed, leaves to her credit a total_0⁻ which, after deducting the cost of feed, leaves to her credit a total of feed, leaves to her credit a total of \$73.15, to say nothing of a bouncing heifer calf. I consider the use of scales and keeping a daily record of great value in a dairy herd, as I am convinced that Jacoba E. gave several thousand more than the previous year, as we were able to keep track of how she was doing, and took greater interest in the work.
