Light ewes, \$4.25 to \$4.50; heavy, \$3 to \$3.50 and bucks and culls, \$2.50 to \$3.50. Hogs also are stronger at \$7.50 to \$7.75 f.o.b. country points.

The course of prices at Montreal has been almost to the point of a slump at the early part of the week, with conditions improving with cooler weather. Ten quarter steers bring \$7.50 and fair to good, \$6 to \$7. Butcher cows go at \$5 to \$5.75; a few choice ones selling as high as \$6; bulls, \$2 to \$2.50. Sheep suffered a decline. Ewes, \$3 to \$3.75; lambs, \$7. Calves are \$3 to \$8 each according to size and quality.

MONTREAL HOG MARKET
Montreal, Saturday, July 20.—There was a stronger feeling in the market here for live hogs, and prices showed an advance of 5 to 10 cwt. as compared with a week ago, and there is every prospect of a still further advance in prices unless the supply increases. There was a good demand from packers and sales of selected lots were made from \$9.50 to \$9.75 a cwt., weighed off cars.

The market for dressed hogs was steady and unchanged, with a firm tone, and sales of fresh-killed abattoir stock were made at \$12.25 to \$12.50 a cwt.

EXPORT BUTTER AND CHEESE

Montreal, Saturday, July 20.—The cheese market this week opened with an easier feeling and prices showed a decline from the high-water mark of the previous week, colored cheese selling at 12 1/2 cts. at Peterboro and Brockville, but there was an active demand from Great Britain at these prices, which was reflected at the country markets at the close of the week, when colored cheese sold up to 12 1/2 cts. White cheese was more or less neglected and are selling at from 12 1/2 to 12 3/4 cts. and at these prices it is difficult to effect sales with the other side. The demand seems to be for colored cheese. The supply of this article is increasing as a large number of factories that usually make white are now making colored, and there is no doubt that there will be more than is needed to supply the demand in the near future, and it would not be surprising to find colored cheese selling at less money than white. The receipts this week total 77,000, which is quite a drop from the high mark reached last week when the total was over 90,000 and would indicate that we have passed the flush of the make and that from now on the receipts will steadily decrease in volume.

The market for butter is strong with a steady demand from the West, and a good speculative demand from Montreal dealers, who are putting away stocks for winter use. The finest Eastern Townships creamery is quoted at 25 1/2 cts. here, with some dealers asking as high as 25 1/2 cts. This is a record price for butter at this season of the year, never before in the history of the trade has butter in the extreme. It remains to be seen whether they will get their money back next winter.

STOCK FEATURES AT OTTAWA

New educational features and attractions are being secured every week for the Dominion Exhibition to be held in Ottawa from September 6th to 16th. These innovations, with the enlargements in the main departments of the Fair, will tax the accommodation of the hundreds of acres of grounds and immense buildings at Ottawa. The association has prepared a bulletin of the features, so far arranged, which will be sent to any applicant. This bulletin and the price list, also ready for mailing on request, should be read by all persons anxious to learn of the wide scope of the 1912 Dominion Exhibition.

More prominence will be given the prize winning animals at the Dominion Exhibition than has been usual at past Ottawa Exhibitions. On Thursday, September 12th, and on Saturday, September 14th, at 1:30 p.m., respectively, all the cattle and horses capturing premiums will be led around the race track, with their newly won laurels. The championship stallions, one of each breed, which will be designated by a card, will also be exhibited before the grand stand.

Another innovation will be the parading of heavy horses in strings of ten in competition for purses, totalling \$100. The stallions will be shown on Friday and Saturday, the last two days of the Exhibition, and the heavy horses on Saturday, only.

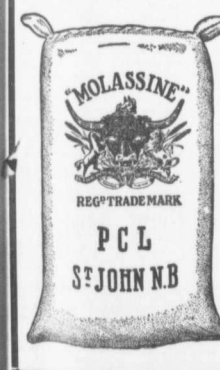
