17 And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Eli'as, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for the Lord. Is And Zachari'as said unto the angel, Whereby shall I know this? for I am an old man, and my wife well stricken in years.

19 And the angel answering said unto him, I am Ga'briel, that stand in the presence of God; and am sent to speak unto thee, and to shew thee these glad tidings.

22 And when he came out, he could not speak unto them: and they perceived that he had seen a vision in the temple. in the temple: for he beckoned unto them, and remained speechless.

23 And it came to pass, that, as soon as the days of his ministration were accomplished, he departed to his own house.

THE LESSON RETOLD
