

An Exquisite Font.-The Church of St. Mary and All Saints, Little Waltingham, is well known throughout England for its magnificent font, a model of which was in the Crystal Palace for many years. It stands on an elaborate base of three steps, richly carved and fashioned as a Maltese cross. The basin rests upon a pedestal adorned with figures of the Evangelists and the four Latin doctors of the church (St. Gregory, St. Ambrose, St. Augustine, and St. Jerome), with accompanying angels, all sadly mutilated. The old roofs of oak, covered with lead, still remain, and are fairly weather-proof, though sometimes in heavy rain the congregation become unpleasantly aware of big drops falling on their Sunday hats or heads, but this state of things has largely been remedied. It is noteworthy that there is a good organ, and the services are very well rendered by a choir which is above the average for a country church. The organist is a singularly talented and sympathetic player, blind from birth, and it is curious that until recently dagh, in memory of the late Mrs. F. the organ blower was similarly and the church is vastly improved

The foundation-stone of the south transept of Setby Abbey was laid by Mrs. Liversedge, the wife of Mr. William Liversedge, who is bearing the whole cost of the rebuilding, in the presence of a very large company of people the other day. The Bishop of Beverley conducted the office. It is probable that the south transept will be finished next year, and it is expected that the Archbishop of York will (D.V.) be present at the opening.

The fine screen of Rattery Church, a few miles from Totnes, in Devon, has been repaired through the generosity of the Misses Carew, of Marley House, and was replaced in the church in readiness for Easter. It is forty feet long, and of the type peculiar to Devonshire, with some unusual detail. Much of it had disappeared, but the missing portions have been and beautified by the renewal.
