Bill to them referred, and had made several amendments thereto-He then delivered the Bill, with the amendments, in at the Clerk's Table, where the same were severally read, and on the question severally put thereon, agreed to by the House.

Ordered, that the Bill as amended, be engrossed.

The House, according to the order of the day, resolved itself into a Committec of the whole House, on consideration of a Bill, " for reimbursing the ex-" pences of the Members of the Legislative Council, incurred by them for " actual attendance in General Assembly."

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Smith took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Smith, from the Committee, reported, that they had gone into consideration of the Bill to them referred --- that in the Committee the following resolution was moved and seconded, to wit,---

Resolved, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that the further consideration of this Bill be postponed for three months;---on which resolution, the Committee divided as follows :---
