At the GENERAL-ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HALIFAX, on the Sixth Day of June, Anno Domini 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by feveral Prorogations until the Twelfth Day of October, Anno Domini 1773, in the Thirteenth Year of His faid Majesty's Reign, being the Fifth GENERAL-ASSEMBLY convened in the faid Province.

Preamble.

* HEREAS great Frauds have been, and are daily committed in several of the Ports and Rivers of this Province, by relanding Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, after the same have been cleared out for Exportation, and that a Drawback thereon has

been allowed on Certificates fraudulently obtained of the landing thereof out of the Province.

I. Be it Enacted, by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, That from and after the First Day of January; One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Four, no Drawback thall be allowed on Rum or other diffilled Spirithous Liquors brought to any of the Ports or Places of this Province (Halifax and Canfo.excepted.)
