this Province, have freely and voluntarily refolved, to give and grant to your Majeffy, your heirs and successors, the several duties on Licences hereinafter mentioned, and in such manner and form as hereinaster expressed. And therefore most humbly befeech your Majesty, that it may be enacted; And be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "an Act to repeal cer ain parts of an Act passed in the sourteenth year of his Majefly's reign, entitled, " an Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province, and by the authority of the fame; That there shall be raised, collected and paid to his Majefty, his hears, and fuccessors, to and for the public uses of this Province, and the support of the Government thereof, the several and respective duties hereinafter mentioned, for and upon the leveral respective Licences to be taken ou in manner and by the persons hereinaster mentioned, that is to fay, on or before the fifth day of April next, there shall be taken out a Licence by every Hawker, Pedlar and Petty thapman, and every Trading perion or perions, going from Town to Town, or to other men's houses, or who have not become householders by permanent relidence in any town or place within this Province, by or for the space of one year previous to the palling of this Act or travelling either on toot or with a horse or horses, als or effes, mule or mules, or o her beaft bearing or drawing burthen, boat or boats, decked veffel or other craft, or otherwise, within this Province, carrying to fell, or exposing to tale any goods, wares or merchandizes, for which Licences, there shall be paid the following sums at the time such Licence shall be taken out. For every man travelling on foot, the fum of three pounds, current money of this Province; for every horfe, als or mule, or other beaft bearing or drawing burthen, the fum of twenty thalling yearly, for each beaft he shall so trivel with over and above the first mentioned sum of three pounds; for every man failing with a decked veffel, trading and expofing for fale any goods, wares and merchandizes, on board or from the same, the fum of eight counds; for every man trading with a boat or other craft, and exposing for sale good, were and merchandize, for each boat or crast, the lum of five pounds; for every person other than such persons as are herein before def ribe, who may come into this Province and expose goods for fale, who shall not have become a householder by permanent residence in any Town or place within this Province, for the space of one year previous to the paffing of this Aci, the fum of eight pounts.
