YUKON HEADQUARTERS. Dawson, N.T., April 3.—Official Yukon is a quantity as to-day in the date set by law for convening of the annual session of the Legislature, but at present the Yukon is without an official head. Advice from Ottawa, made a wholesale clearing out of officials a few days ago and failing to replace them has left the Yukon an orphan among the territories of Canada. It has no executive to co-operate with anything the Legislature might do. Before an application can be voted at Ottawa to carry on business it is quite likely that the Legislature will adjourn. There are some emergency matters that are demanding attention, which cannot be disposed of at this time.
