FAREWELL SERVICE OF  
REV A M Bent.

All Saints' Church was filled last  
Sunday evening on the occasion of the  
farewell of Rev. A. M. Bent, Mr.  
Bent has been Rector of the Parish  
for over seven years. The service was  
splendidly rendered by a choir of eight-  
teen voices, accompanied by the Church  
Orchestra. Mr. Bent in his closing  
words asked the sympathy, support and  
co-operation of the congregation for his  
successor in the Rectorship, and  
was glad to say that there would be  
no lapse in the services and activities  
of the Parish consequent on the re-  
signation. He gave an interesting stat-  
istical report of his seven years' mini-  
stry and of the present satisfactory  
financial condition of the Parish. The  
work of the Women's Guild was par-  
ticularly praised. At the request of the  
Churchwardens, the Rev. Canon Wilson  
asked the parishioners to show their  
appreciation of Mr. Bent's services  
by contributing to the Church collec-  
tions for the day, which would be  
given to him to assist in defraying the  
expenses of removal. The amount in  
the collection was \$44.36. A large  
number of friends waited after the  
service to bid farewell to the Rev.  
gentleman and his family. Mr. Bent  
will be much missed in this community,  
where his genial disposition and a  
bounding sympathy were much valued.  
Mr. Bent and his family left for their  
new home in Kentville last Monday  
morning.
