EXPORTS TO THE U.S.

Trade Went Up With the Lowering of the American Tariff.

CUSTOMS REPORT AT BUFFALO The Last Four Months of This Year Show a Marked Increase in Canadian Imports.

Buffalo, Dec. 31.—The Buffalo customs house is generally regarded as a good barometer indicating the trade with Canada, and as most of the imports entered here are from Canada, the customs reports are of unusual interest.

Since the adoption of the new tariff there has been a very large impetus to the Canadian trade. This is shown by a comparative statement of the value of entries of goods free of duty for the last four months of 1894 and 1895.

It is also shown that during the last four months of 1894 the decrease in customs collections has been but \$8,000 as compared with the previous year, while the decline in the preceding eight months was fully \$275,000.
