"A LECTURER FROM PALESTINE." -The Rev. He lectured several times in Wolfville during last month, on the following subjects :- "My home and history," "From Jerusalem to Bethlem," "Life in Palestine." On Tuesday he delivered his lecture "Lebanon and my school days," in vestry of Baptist church. While the information is valuable on its own account, the main object of these lectures is to illustrate and explain main passages in Scripture which depend for their clearness upon knowledge of the locality, and life of the east. He proposes to conduct a course of lectures in the interests of temperance, and bring his experience to bear on the subject. 
