## ROME LETTER.

(From our own Correspondent).

Rome, April 27th, 1912.

With excellent reason the inauguration of the Campanile of Venice, the bell-tower of S. Mark's, on the very site of that which fell ten years ago, may be called the festival of Italy by the Patriarch of Venice the Campanile was blessed along with the six bells rejoicing in the names of La Naragona that used to summon the nobles, La Nona by which the markets were assembled, La Dinghiera that pealed out the note of gladness, La Trotteria that told the nobles of the hour of Council, and La Pregiada that sounded when justice had been meted out to a criminal. The chief cities of Italy had representatives there; the royal family was represented; and tens of thousands of foreigners and Italians looked with joy on what may be called the re-erection of the thousand year old tower that had crumbled with sheer old age; the Senate and Chamber of Deputies were represented, as was also the Government by the Minister of Public Instruction. From the Pope came some days previously a letter of congratulation on its completion; by the S. Congregation of Rites a special prayer had been approved for the blessing; Mr. Forest, Director of the Statue Choir, had composed part of the music on the occasion; and three thousand Venetian children sang a hymn around the object to which the life of Venice converges in the beautiful Square of S. Mark.

From the summit of the Campanile the panorama of the 'Fairy City' was seen in all its quaint beauty, its thousands of canals spanned by thousands of bridges, its rich churches and stately spires with their crowning gables, and then the eye turned with awe to the palace of the Doge, where the Doge and the terrible Council of Ten administered justice, and one recalled what a serious business it was to hold the office of Doge of Venice since History tells us: 'Five of the first fifty Doges abdicated; five were banished with their eyes put out; nine were deposed; five were massacred; and two fell in battle.'

It may be said that within the past week Rome has received within the Aurelian walls a body representing nearly every part of Europe Germany sent along a body of nearly four hundred pilgrims; Belgium was represented by another body, among it a delegation from the Catholic journalists of the country; North Italy despatched two hundred; Switzerland has sent here six hundred pilgrims; Austria two hundred; Spain one hundred and fifty, and ancient Latium on the closure of the Congress sent one thousand men to the Papal throne. France sent no less than three pilgrimages during the previous week, two are to come later, one from Ireland. And so every country in the world has been kneeling before the white-robed Prince of the Vatican except degraded little Portugal that has bowed her head so meekly under the Masonic yoke.

By the London correspondent of a widely-read American Catholic weekly we are smoothly told: 'Great excitement has been caused in ecclesiastical circles in the East and also in Rome by the news that on the application of the lay Armenian Council the Armenian Patriarch, Monsignor Terzian, has been deposed from his spiritual office by an imperial firman.' The advice one may give the correspondent is to possess his soul in patience. Not a ripple appeared on the calm sea within the Vatican because a parcel of masons and infidels of the Young Turks hearkened to the intrigues of a group of Armenian rebels and issued a decree signed by the helpless Sultan deposing His Beatitude Peter Paul XIII. Not even a chirp was knocked off the Rock of Peter by the 'great excitement' for all those trifles do not cost a thought to the old man at the Vatican; he has been used to little things like these for two thousand years, and he knows by experience how they fit all.

'Another matter regarding the correspondent in his reference to His Eminence Cardinal Bourne as 'Primate of England,' would it not be as well for him to wait for the Holy Father and the Sacred Congregation to grant this title to the Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster? On the strength of many years' experience I can solemnly assure the correspondent in question that the Holy Father will be scarcely guided exclusively by the opinion of the London journalists in this matter, as there are quite a number of cardinals who will wish to have a say in it.'
