The Modern Battleship

By GEORGE FITCH, Author of "At Good Old Swash."

Next to the baseball star, nothing looks as magnificent as a few years of good back into obscurity as swiftly as a modern battleship.

The lives of both are about the same in length. Hans Wagner and Larry Lajoie, now headed for the minors, have played a little less than twenty years in the big leagues. The Oregon, the pride of the United States Navy, twenty-three years ago, is now a quaint little tub of junk, cherished for its victories, but not seriously regarded as a fighter. With its sister ships, the Massachusetts and Indiana, it is the oldest battleship in the service, and it is very likely that next year these ships will be made targets for the newer vessels, as the Texas was a couple of years ago.

The Oregon displaces 10,000 tons, steams 15 knots an hour, and has four thirteen-inch guns. The Gloucester, a German battle cruiser which is bottled up in the Dardanelles, is two years old, displaces 22,000 tons, steams 28 knots an hour and has ten eleven-inch guns, while the newest Brazilian battleship, the Rio de Janeiro, displaces 22,500 tons and has fourteen twelve-inch guns with twenty six-inch new style guns, which are almost as wicked as the Oregon's old thirteen-inch barbers.

Competition has done it and competition in battleships is the kind of competition which makes a man climb a tree faster than a bear. Twenty years ago no one thought of putting speed into a battleship. But the newest German battleship, fast and armed from stem to stern, could waddle out after the Mauretania and overhaul it in a steam chase. A British battle cruiser holds the speed record across the Atlantic and the great battle cruisers of Great Britain and Germany are now being completed with 100,000 horsepower, four armed sides and as much gun powder as four Oregon, will be able to run into most of the torpedo boat destroyers of this country from behind and butt them into eternity without wasting powder. Marvelling at the dainty and fragile Imperator, Aquitania and Olympic, with their 50,000 tons and 23 knots speed, or at the 20-knot Lusitania, is a waste of time. The battleship designers have stuffed more power and speed into ships two-thirds the length and much faster amidships. If universal peace comes as a result of the war, what a bunch of ocean greyhounds can be manufactured out of the battle cruisers.

Oct. 3rd. From George Forsay (Grand Bank). One hanker has returned with no fish and two schooners from the grounds with 50 and 100 quintals each. Prospects are poor, and bait is very scarce. There would be a little cod if bait were obtainable but no squid and very little herring can be had. The bankers have done very poorly owing to the difficulty in procuring bait.

Oct. 3rd. From F. R. Dinham (Eagle Point to Mail Bay)—The catch to date is 7,985 qts. but for last week nil, as no boats, dories or skiffs were out. Prospects are most gloomy, and bait is very scarce. The schooner Louise H. has been refitted and is having full of water at her moorings.
