LONDON, To-day. The Austro-German armies, which now appear to be working in perfect concert as a result of German selves after the retreat from Calicia, simultaneously with the German ef-Dneister and have succeeded in crossing the river at several points. 

MAMMOTH AT CHATHAM.

"Under the direction of the officials of the British Museum, excavations are being made on Government land near Chatham, with the object of securing intact the skeleton of a huge mammoth, which had been accidentally partially exposed during some digging operations there," says, the Daily News. "As each part of the remains of the colossal animal is disinterred it is placed in plaster of Paris, and carefully packed ready for removal. One tusk which was dug out measured nine feet in length. The work will occupy several weeks."
