French Ship Towed to Port.

WILL REQUIRE CONSIDERABLE
REPAIRS.

The French barq. Vinna, 33 days
out from Oporto, bound to St. Pierre
with a cargo of salt, was towed to
port yesterday morning in a some-
what damaged condition by the tug
John Green. The vessel has her fore-
mast sprung and will require consid-
erable repairs. A message to Hon.
Tasler Cook, French Consul, received
on Friday night, intimated that a
French barquentine was in distress off
Portugal Cove and was asking for as-
sistance. The tug John Green was
dispatched, and located the vessel
about a quarter of a mile off land.

Premier Missing.

LAST HEARD OF AT GRAND
FALLS.

The Prime Minister of Newfound-
land is missing. Since he left for
Grand Falls on Tuesday night nothing
has been heard of him, but it is
believed that he joined yesterday's
express en route to England, via Can-
ada. Enquiries at his office this morn-
ing revealed no news of his where-
abouts. Hon. W. R. Warren, approach-
ed this morning, said he thought Sir
Richard was at Grand Falls, but was
not sure that he is still there. Sir
Richard Squires, Hon. W. F. Coaker,
Hon. Dr. Campbell and Major Jen-
nings left for Grand Falls in a private
car attached to a freight on Friday
night. No reward will be paid for in-
formation as to their whereabouts.

Short of Flour.

DESTITUTION AT RIGOLET.

Destitution is reported at Rigolet
by S.S. Ranger, which reached port
yesterday from the Labrador. When
the ship arrived there, her provision
cargo had to be immediately dis-
charged as the people were on their
last pan of flour. Conditions at Car-
wright were not so bad. This has been
a very good season for fur on the
Labrador, and the trappers did very
well. The people of Labrador are
anxious to buy cats and made an offer
of \$25 for the Ranger's tabby. There
seems to be every likelihood of the
formation of a cat ranch to supply
the Labrador, if this price is main-
tained. The Ranger also reports hav-
ing picked up a motor boat five miles
off Grates Cove, containing two men,
William and Thomas Smith. The boat
had developed engine trouble and was
drifting to sea. The men were on
their way here to go fishing. They
were bound from Trinity Bay.

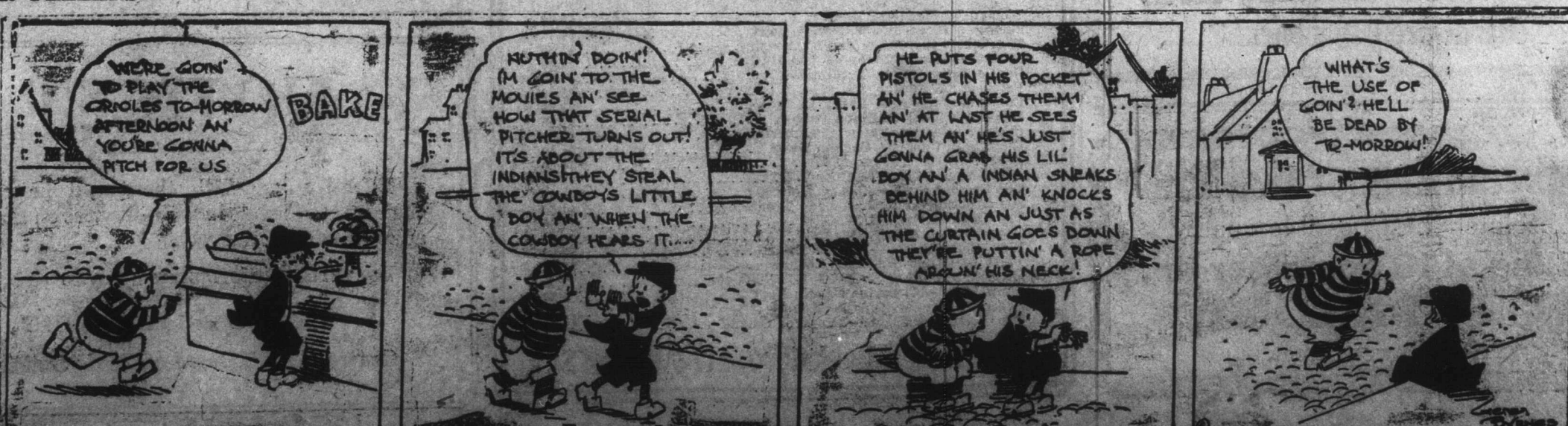
